THE MEANING OF ADVENT

"Advent" means 'Coming' in Latin and is the name given to the 4 Sundays and weeks before Christmas. We are asked to prepare ourselves to celebrate Jesus' coming into our world and into our lives. This means we must try and say sorry for things we have done wrong like being selfish or mean just like we do in Lent when we prepare for Jesus' resurrection. This is why the priest and deacons will wear purple to remind us to be sorry.

You can make an Advent calendar for yourself or your family with messages to remind you to be a nice person like "help someone today", "phone a person who is alone", "smile and say 'Hello' to someone", or "play a game together".

THE PHILIPPINES

The formal Christmas celebrations start on 16th December when many people go to the first of nine pre-dawn or early morning Masses.

Many people stay awake all night into Christmas day!

Christians go to church to hear the last 'simbang gabi' or the Christmas Eve Mass. This is followed by a midnight feast, called Noche Buena.

POLAND

Christmas Eve is very important. The house is cleaned and the family eats the main Christmas meal of 12 dishes. This is meant to symbolise good luck for the next 12 months and also represent the 12 apostles.

The food is traditionally meat free to remember the animals that are presents at Jesus' birth.

BRAZIL

Many people are Catholic and attend Mass at midnight. Afterwards, there are big firework displays. Sometimes children leave a sock near a window and If Papai Noe (Father Christmas) finds your sock, he'll exchange it for a present!
