LENT



These 40 days leading up to Easter are a time of thinking about the love of Jesus in a very special way.

We have 6 weeks to think about Jesus' life and what he taught us before he died on the cross. Although we *fast* like Jesus did and have special days of prayer, as Fr Stephen said, "It's *not* a time to be gloomy".

We should think instead of ways to make ourselves and other people happy. For example, when we give up sweets and put the 20p into the Smarties tube so that CAFOD can help poor people, we are making their lives happier.

THE SPECIAL DAYS DURING LENT

Tuesday Feb 21st Shrove Tuesday or Pancake Day is the traditional feast day before the start of Lent on *Ash Wednesday Feb 22nd*.

Wednesday Feb 22nd Ash Wednesday – the ashes are made from palm branches that were blessed on the previous year's Palm Sunday. These are placed on our foreheads by the priest or deacon with the words "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return"

Sunday March 19th Mothering Sunday is a day honouring mother churches, the church where one is baptised and becomes "a child of the church" on the fourth Sunday in Lent.

Saturday March 25th The Annunciation of the Lord commemorates the visit of the archangel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary, during which he informed her that she would be the mother of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

Sunday April 2nd Passion Sunday, or Palm Sunday is a holiday commemorating Jesus Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem before his suffering and death on the cross.



Friday, April 7th Good Friday is a Christian Holiday commemorating the crucifixion of Jesus Christ and his death at Calvary.

Saturday April 8th Holy Saturday is the day after Good Friday. It is the day before Easter and the last day of **Holy Week** in which Christians prepare for Easter. It commemorates the day that Jesus' body lay in the tomb.

Sunday April 9th April Easter Sunday or Resurrection Sunday, [Holy day of obligation] is a festival and holiday celebrating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, described in the New Testament as having occurred on the third day of his burial after his crucifixion by the Romans at Calvary c. 30 AD. It is the culmination of the passion of Jesus, preceded by Lent (or Great Lent), a forty-day period of fasting, prayer, and penance.

ASHES ON THE FOREHEAD

We wear ashes on our forehead to remind us that we don't live forever and that we need to confess our sins and try to be better people.

We don't wear ashes to proclaim our holiness but to acknowledge that we are **SINNERS** who are in need of repentance & renewal



DID YOU KNOW ?

-**Lent** is an old English word meaning 'lengthen' because it's spring, the time when the days start getting longer.

-**Shrove** Tuesday comes from the Anglo-Saxon word '**shriven**' which means to confess. People went to confession before Lent started and were "shriven" (absolved from their sins).

LENT SMARTIES CHALLENGE!




We've handed out tubes of Smarties to all the young people in our parish family.
